APIARY NOTES - Tim Bullock

May has been an interesting month to say the least, wet and cool for the first 10 days then drying and warming up since then (at the time of writing), so who knows if we'll have a June gap this year or not. Personally, I think there won't be – things have been later than 'usual' but things are catching up now.... Keep checking that there are enough stores in colonies to keep them going. If you do need to feed then go for the little and often method as we don't want them drawing syrup down into the brood box or supers, feeding now is for consumption.

The oilseed rape should now finish flowering so if you have colonies close by now is the time to clear supers and extract the honey if you haven't done it yet as it will granulate quickly. Better that this happens in a honey bucket rather than in capped supers.

I'm sure that swarming is going to be an issue right through June this year, so stick to a maximum of 7 days between inspections. It may be worth doing an artificial swarm on strong colonies even if they aren't showing signs of swarming – at least we're in control and you get the benefit of another colony!!

Don't forget that water demands will be high, not much of an issue at the moment but as natural water sources dry up make sure that there are water sources for colonies – I have a large plant saucer with a sponge in full of water close to the outside tap available (it also gets used by the local hedgehogs as a bonus!)

Asian Hornet

On Thursday 13th April the National Bee Unit received a credible Asian hornet sighting from Folkestone, Kent. The following week the National Bee Unit received a credible Asian hornet sighting with a photo taken on the deck of a ferry from Poole, Dorset to Cherbourg on 10th April 2023. Bee Keeping History

Did you know?

1538 - The Spanish imported the first colony of honeybees to South America.

1730 - Colonisers in America set up over 170,000 beehives, challenging the price of hogs and sheep.

1779 - The Continental Congress in the United States adopted the image of a beehive as the logo for its currency.

1851 - L.L. Langstroth, the father of American beekeeping, modifies Dzierzon's design to create a completely movable frame.

1890 - William Broughton Carr, an English beekeeper, invents the WBC beehive, a double-walled hive with a pitched roof. It contains wooden boxes to hold the frames of brood and honey.
