APIARY NOTES - Tim Bullock (Chair)

Spring weather this year has been the complete opposite to last year in that we've had 27mm of rain since the end of February and currently the forecast shows no rain for the next 10-14 days. Nectar flow has been very good to date but as ground dries up even more it may well grind to a halt anytime soon. The June gap could be quite long this year if the weather doesn't break. We may need to feed through this gap especially if we've taken supers off for extraction. If you do need to feed then go for the little and often method as we don't want them drawing syrup down into the brood box or supers, feeding now is for consumption.

The oilseed rape is coming off flower so if you have colonies close by now is the time to clear supers and extract the honey if you haven't done it yet as it will granulate quickly. Better that this happens in a honey bucket rather than in capped supers.

Swarming is still likely to happen during June so stick to a maximum of 7 days between inspections. It may be worth doing an artificial swarm on strong colonies even if they aren't showing signs of swarming – at least we're in control and you get the benefit of another colony!!

Don't forget that water demands will be high so make sure that there are water sources for colonies – I have a large plant saucer with a sponge in full of water close to the outside tap available (it also gets used by the local hedgehogs as a bonus!)

TWIGS AND PARK FARM APIARIES

TWIGS The training apiary is now running well with there being a total of 5 operational hives for the club. The two new hives which were purchased early this year now have 2 supers on which are filling fast and these were used for April's Taster Day's practical session.

Two hives, that came through winter, have grown rapidly and as a result one hive continued to grow and another brood box was added when more queen cells were found. This did stop the production of more queen cells but the calmness of the bees has led myself and Barry to think this hive will be good for queen raising. We have now placed a Nicot queen rearing tray for the queen to lay eggs into this hive. We will keep you updated as to how these progresses.

Park Farm had one nuc come through Winter and this was placed into a full-size hive early last month. Unfortunately, it has still swarmed but on examination we managed to catch an emerging Queen and she was placed into a nuc. She has now mated and started to lay. In the main hive we are still waiting for a queen to emerge and mate. If this is unsuccessful we have the option to reunite with the nuc.

There is also a 2 ended nuc which consists of 3 frames on each side with a queen cell. Again, we are looking to increase the total hives with as many splits as we can (see photo below)
